Event Description

On September 16th, 2024, a new wave of ambitious engineering students stepped into SIES GST, bringing fresh ideas and bright ambitions. Full of hope and vision, these young minds were introduced to various teams, each providing distinct avenues for growth and collaboration. This moment signalled the beginning of an inspiring journey, as these future innovators combined their creativity and technical talents, ready to make a lasting impact.

DAY 1:

The first day of the Induction Programme began with students assembling in the GST auditorium, organised by batches, to embark on their academic journey. The event started with the hosts warmly introducing themselves and highlighting the institute's core values to the excited newcomers. A heartfelt prayer song and a ceremonial lighting of the lamp brought a sense of purpose and tradition to the occasion. Principal Dr. K. Lakshmi Sudha officially opened the session, offering valuable insights into the legacy and opportunities at SIES Graduate School of Technology. Following her address, Advisor Dr. P.V. Parameswaran shared words of encouragement and guidance. The HOD of Humanities and Applied Sciences took the stage next, outlining the expectations and guidelines for first-year students. Dr. Smitha Kumar, along with the student council, explained the induction program's objectives, emphasising the council's responsibilities and the institute's vision for nurturing holistic development. The Vice-Principal, Dr. Aparna Banore, concluded the formal proceedings with a heartfelt vote of thanks. The day ended on a patriotic note with the NSS Pledge and the National Anthem. The orientation program was conducted across four sessions, ensuring each branch had a focused and enriching experience.

DAY 2:

Sessions were arranged for the students, who were divided into different groups. The 1st group had a Yoga session which was conducted by the NSS UNIT of SIES GST. The 2nd group had a POSH seminar conducted by Pooja Gupta, a UHV session for the 3rd Group hosted by Prof. Vinayak Shete and a session on Depression in Youth and Management for the 4th group hosted by Dr. Rahul Bhatambre & Mr. Swapnil Bhopi.

Yoga Session: It was conducted by Prof. Pranita Mahajan alongside NSS volunteers of SIES GST.

UHV Session: This session was hosted by Mr. Vinayak Shete; in this session some important points about mental health and the environment were explained to the first-year students.

Depression in Youth and Management: This session was hosted by Dr. Rahul Bhatambre & Mr. Swapnil Bhopi; the first-year students were educated about the major reasons behind depression over recent years in youth.

The students were then introduced to various student council teams and student chapters.



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The Literary Team: The Literary Team hosted a meet and greet for first-year students, kicking off with a funny skit. They introduced team members and shared insights about The Literary Team's essence, unity, and event highlights. A resume writing workshop emphasized resume importance, followed by a creative activity: crafting resumes for fictional characters. The event wrapped up with fun games like "guess the movie" and "Skribbl" offering an engaging introduction to The Literary Team's dynamic atmosphere.

IETE: The main objective was to familiarize the FE students and acquaint them with the esteemed faculty, the advantages of being a part of IETE, and the significant workshops and major events conducted by the ISF like Techxter, Ideation and Projection.

The TE and BE Core Members, in addition to briefly introducing each event, orchestrated a mini-ideation activity. FE students were grouped and tasked with solving a simple real-world question and listing down the solutions. Guided by the TE and BE core members, the FE students embarked on a journey of collaborative ideation, underscoring teamwork and innovative thinking.

ARENA: Arena aims to promote a coding culture within the college. The main objective was to interact with the students and give them a brief introduction to what Competitive Programming and Logic Building is in general and introduce to them what kinds of events Arena conducts throughout the year. Bug4Ever, Turing Cup, Girls Setter League.

Through these sessions ARENA introduced freshers to competitive programming, highlighted its significance in enhancing problem-solving skills, and outline the various activities and opportunities available through Arena.

Cultural Team: The day kicked off with an energetic presentation that highlighted the cultural team's important role in shaping the college experience. Key events such as "Flea & Frolic," celebrating cultural diversity, and "Cognition," a technical fest that showcases students' intellectual achievements, were introduced.

The presentation also featured unique college celebrations like "Tie and Saree Day," promoting professionalism and confidence, and the "Independence Day" celebrations, which focus on patriotism and unity. A major highlight was the reveal of "TML" – "Tatva Moksha Lakshya," a highly anticipated event that promises to engage students in exciting ways.

The hosts then introduced the college's cultural clubs, showcasing the variety of talent within the student body. The Singing and Music Club, "Aaroha," invited freshmen to join in singing, while the Cultural Team organized an interactive gaming marathon to keep everyone involved.

The Western dance group "Moksh" delivered a captivating performance, leaving the audience in awe with their synchronized choreography and fluid movements. Next, the play "Aarambh" took the




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audience on an emotional journey through the theme of beginnings, combining humor and depth for an unforgettable theatrical experience.

The day ended with a breathtaking cultural dance performance by "Aagmi," which blended traditional and modern elements, celebrating the rich diversity of cultures through stunning choreography, vibrant costumes, and rhythmic beats.

Media Team: The team took charge of documenting the entire induction through photography, focusing on preserving the special moments and connections that made the event meaningful. They also managed the live streaming, allowing a broader audience to participate in the event. From the official inauguration to interactive workshops, the Media Team ensured every key moment was captured.

To strengthen the connection with the new students, the Media Team organized a session to introduce their mission, responsibilities, and role in enhancing the college experience. They also showcased last year's TML Aftermovie, sparking interest in media and visual storytelling. Impressively, the team shared the full set of event photos just one day after the induction, giving participants the chance to relive and share their experiences. The session aimed to foster a sense of belonging and encourage students to get involved with the Media Team's efforts.

They concluded the session by showing some of their work in the past year and addressing any queries.

WDC(Posh): A seminar on the POSH (Prevention of Sexual Harassment) Act was held by the Women Development Cell (WDC) of SIESGST on September 19th and 20th, 2024, at the GST Auditorium. The session featured speakers CS Pooja (Gupta) Singhal, an expert in corporate governance and gender equality, and Smt. Rajasri Nagarajan, an advocate who provides free legal aid to women and children.

The seminar focused on the POSH Act, which requires companies with more than ten employees to establish an Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) to address sexual harassment complaints confidentially and promptly. Case studies illustrating incidents that led to the creation of the Act were shared, providing real-world context for the legal framework. The session also emphasized the importance of fostering a workplace culture of respect and safety. It aimed to equip participants with the knowledge to recognize and address sexual harassment, promoting awareness and responsibility in the workplace.

Technical Team: The Technical Team decided to give out maximum exposure to all the newcomers and welcome them to a technical bachelor's degree program with sessions on introduction to new technology and developing new skills in them. All the members of the Management domain were shortly introduced. They briefly explained the roles of all the domains followed by the main events of the technical team. All the App domain members were shortly introduced. Students got to know about App development. They have explained the role of App developers and various technologies used in app development. All the Game domain members were shortly introduced. Students got to know about what a game developer is, and the role of a game developer. Robotics and web domain were also



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introduced. The event ended with a quiz competition held which was based on the information received about the domains.

IEEE: IEEE SIESGST welcome first-year students and introduce them to the council's mission, structure, and activities. The event highlighted IEEE's three main sub-chapters: Computer Society (CS), Microwave Theory and Techniques Society (MTTS), and Women in Engineering (WIE), each offering unique opportunities based on student interests.

Students were also introduced to flagship events like "Techopedia" and "Epsilon," which focus on developing technical skills, teamwork, and leadership through hands-on learning and collaboration. The induction created a welcoming atmosphere, fostering a sense of belonging and encouraging students to actively engage in their college journey within a supportive community.

E-Cell: The session aimed to introduce the students to E-Cell's core mission of fostering entrepreneurial skills and mindset, along with an overview of the team, past events, and significant achievements. The team began by highlighting their recent events and core values, giving the students insight into the range of opportunities available to them through E-Cell's initiatives.

To keep the energy high, a fun and interactive brand logo guessing game was organized, where students were challenged to identify popular brand logos, creating a competitive yet enjoyable atmosphere. The game proved to be a hit, stirring excitement among the students and helping them feel more connected to the team and each other. The session wrapped up with a Q&A, allowing the students to share their ideas, ask questions, and express their interest in E-Cell's future endeavors.

Team Promethean: The Promethean team shared an overview of their team, highlighting its purpose, goals, and role within the engineering community. The team showcased some key events, one of which is **Matrix**, a confidence-building initiative for first-year students. This event includes a diverse range of activities such as Quiz, Ink the Intellect, ISRO Wordplay, Treasure Hunt, Science Snap, and the Triple Threat Debate. Each challenge hones students' critical thinking, communication, and teamwork, fostering a vibrant and collaborative atmosphere that sets a remarkable tone for their engineering journey. Apart from Matrix, other events highlighted were Terra Talk, a series of Instagram Live sessions focused on environmental conservation, and **SustainX**, their flagship event aimed at engaging first-year students in meaningful activities.

The session concluded with a fun Heads-Up game, encouraging active participation and helping students connect in a relaxed, enjoyable atmosphere. Through this session, Team Promethean aimed to inspire the new students to get involved and make the most of their time at SIES GST.

CSI: The CSI Council hosted an engaging technical session for first year engineering students, introducing them to the exciting world of the organization. The event began with an introduction to the council's mission and vision, followed by an overview of the various workshops, seminars, and competitions that help develop technical skills and encourage community involvement.

A standout moment was the game "4 Pictures, 1 Word", which promoted teamwork and critical thinking around emerging industry themes, making the learning experience both fun and dynamic. The session wrapped up with details on membership, outlining the benefits of joining, including access to exclusive events, networking opportunities, and skill development workshops. The session aimed to



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inspire first-year students to get involved and take advantage of the many opportunities available.

Depression In Youth and Management: The NSS Unit of SIES Graduate School of Technology conducted a workshop concerning Depression in Youth and management. The speaker for the session was Dr. Swapnil Bhopl (M.Phil., RCI), a clinical. He engaged the students in an interesting talk, educating them the major reasons behind depression in recent years in youth, the factors causing them, and warned excess usage of Electronic Gadgets and social media. He also suggested methods of relieving these stressful activities.

Sports Team: The Induction started with the introduction of the sports community, sharing their goals, and encouraging teamwork. Freshers were introduced to various other sports teams that represent the college in the university games like the football team, volleyball team, badminton team etc. The team highlighted college's achievements in various sports that their athletes have won over the years. One of the main objectives of the event was introducing Lakhya, the annual college sports fest. The Sports Team provided the freshers with a quick overview of the Lakshya and several sports events organized in it to encourage them to look forward to it as a major part of college life.

To give freshers a closer look at what the sports team is like, a short video was played showing scenes from past events, practices, and matches. The video captured the hard work, friendships, and fun that comes with participating and competing in an event. The session ended with a game called reaction ball, letting the freshers join in on some friendly competition themselves.

Creative Team: The purpose of the Induction session was to introduce first year students to the Creative Team's core mission of nurturing creativity, collaboration, and innovation, along with an overview of the team, notable projects, and key achievements. The team kicked things off by showcasing some of their recent projects and emphasizing their core values, giving the students a glimpse into the unique and impactful opportunities available through the Creative Team's initiatives. To keep the session lively and engaging, an interactive "Design Challenge" was organized, where students were invited to create quick concept sketches based on a given theme. This challenge sparked a sense of healthy competition and fun, encouraging the students to showcase their creative flair while connecting with teammates and fellow students.

The session concluded with an open Q&A, providing an opportunity for the students to share their creative ideas, ask questions, and discuss ways to get involved in the Creative Team's upcoming projects.
