



The activity also included making videos, posters, creative and alternative to Plastic Bags.


















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# Independence Day - 15/08/2020

#### **Event Description**

Baatcheet live launch was organized by the Literary Team on the evening of 23rd October 2020. It began with a beautiful dance performance by the Cultural Team's Aagmi dance group. A heart touching poem by the member of the Literary Team was performed. Sumitra ma'am, our council in-charge then unveiled the Baatcheet Theme Launch Video and Poster. The Theme of Baatcheet is "Singing the Unsung" where we have invited 7 speakers from different walks of life and different domains to enlighten the students of SIES GST. These speakers are ordinary people who are living extraordinary lives. Baatcheet is a live interview series on the Instagram page @gstlitclub starting from 1st November. We hope that all students will get to learn something from these marvellous people. The host of the launch then announced the names of these 7 speakers and their hosts. The live launch came to an end with the vote of thanks.

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The Literary Team SIESGST conducted a series of online live interviews with some of the unsung heroes working towards the betterment of society. Our first speaker Ms. Aqsa Mushtaque—founder of "Azad Aurat Foundation" was interviewed by. Shreyasi Gode on Nov 2, 2020. Ms. Mushtaque has been distributing sanitary napkins among needy women while spreading awareness regarding menstrual health and hygiene among men and women alike under her campaign "Free the Period".

She talked about the covid-19 situation in her hometown, Calcutta and went on to tell the viewers about why she decided to work towards providing sanitary pads to women and her inspiration behind the same. Further, she elaborated about the support her parents provided her and the reasoning behind the name of her organization. When asked about her experiences during the various drives she undertook, she talked about both the positive and negative aspects of her work. She then talked about the various social stigmas related to menstrual health and the role of men volunteers in her work. She gave us some tips on how we can contribute towards spreading awareness about menstrual health and to conclude the session, the host delivered a poem prepared for Ms Mushtaque by the Literary Team.

The episode 2 of BaatCheet-Singing the Unsung Season 1 was conducted on 7<sup>th</sup> November 2020. It was an interactive interview session held digitally on Instagram live for the college students of SIES Graduate School of Technology, Nerul. With host Arfah Upade and guest speaker Ronit Ranjan, a very inspiring and lively interview was carried on.

Our speaker Ronit Ranjan is an ex-army cadet, life coach, personal breakthrough strategist, fitness coach, motivational speaker, an SSB Coach, author and poet who believes in appreciating each and every moment of life and is on a mission to inspire and support people. The session started with the host interviewing the speaker's motivation to join the army which further led to more discussion about SSB (Service Selection Board) coaching. Being an SSB coach, he described some qualities required to be an army officer and that he wishes to teach more aspirants by making it affordable.

The session continued with revealing the speaker's poetic side, he opened up about how he started writing at first. Not being able to play sports again due to injury took his emotional release away and that is how he started writing poems. Our host urged the speaker to read some lines for the viewers and then he recited a heart touching poem from his book.

The interview was carried forward with the speaker talking about his new fundraiser campaign i.e #mentalhealthinschools which are for making mental health compulsory in curriculum in schools. He aims to make mental health study mandatory as a life skill training for a better future for students. The campaign starts with the speaker interacting with various government officials and schools all over India and trying to create an impact from this movement. The session came to an end with the host delivering a poem for the speaker written by the Literary Team.

Shreeyash Changle was the speaker for the 3rd Episode of BAATCHEET - an interactive interview session held digitally on Instagram live, where he enlightened the audience with his initiative of turning ever dry land into a green farm. The interview was focused on major topics like the need of using eco- friendly products, sustainability, environmental balance, etc.

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He is the founder of SWAPNAVANA - an organization which has undertaken numerous projects regarding tree plantation and has planted about 3000 saplings in the past 11 months. He is a nature lover and has a special interest in algae, corals and ferns. He anticipated tree plantation as the need of the hour due to increasing problems of global warming and climate change and got determined to establish an organization for the same.

He shared the future plans of planting 10,000 trees on a barren land of 15 acres creating a healthy ecosystem for mankind. He has organized workshops, campaigns and fun activities for all the age groups. He inspired the audience by giving his views on finding individual insight towards the problems that everyone faces. He elucidated the importance of individual resolutions by saying, "Curving your own emissions, trying not to create more waste, trying to plant more trees, trying to sustain more trees, trying to contribute and donate are activities which would define one's' character."

Later, he explained about the statistical overview of land allotment for forest regions in Maharashtra. He also made students aware about the United Nations Environmental Program which suggests that for any country to be environmentally sustainable and for its ecological balance to be maintained, at least  $1/3^{rd}$  of its land should be forested and should include wildlife, blooming trees and all the factors of nature.

He also shared the difficulties which he faced throughout his journey. He also mentioned the significance of bringing about changes in the studying patterns of environmental science and stressed that the importance of environmental education should be inculcated in children from a young age for the upcoming generations. Lastly, he won the hearts of the viewers when he said "Nurturing a sapling is like parenting a child" and encouraged everyone to plant trees around their locality.

In the 4th episode of Baatcheet, speaker Reeta Bhagat told us about her inspiration behind starting "Happy Faces Foundation".

Being raised in a family that taught her to respect women from a very early age ignited a desire in her to do something for women who struggled for necessities. This desire wasn't hindered even after her marriage and that led to the foundation of "Happy Faces". When asked about how this foundation helps women, our speaker told us Happy Faces conducts workshops at 4 places, 2 at Ahmedabad, 1 in Karnali, and 1 in a tribal area. They teach as well as train women. She even told us how they managed to face the consequences of the pandemic. The foundation tried to bring together women who had sewing machines and they started to manufacture face-masks. They managed to manufacture 3,50,000 masks over the span of two months. She told us to strongly support local artisans. Helping them and supporting their works rather than buying from foreign brands sustains our economy. She shared with us how the foundation has helped a large number of women become financially independent and also shared some stories about them. Her joyous and inspiring way to make women independent has left us all speechless. The session ended with the host reciting a poem as a token of appreciation written by the Literary Team.

In the 05th Episode of BaatCheet, our speaker Mr.Nicholas Furtado shared his initiative for a resort for dogs, a place where dogs come, have fun, run and enjoy some quality time with their owners.

We walked through his journey right from what inspired him to create a friendly environment for dogs till his current scenario and future goals. According to the speaker, Dog resort serves as a place where pet owners can have holiday weekend with their dogs and share bonding with the pets through special activities designed by our speaker's team. He was proud to share that K9 Dog resort is the only resort all over Mumbai for dogs.

Our host also asked about his inspiration for the unique name for his dog resort 'K9'. He made a whole career transition just for his love for dogs. He was not satisfied, working 16hrs in his design and animation career and stepped up to learn and research more about pets and dogs in order to start a resort dedicated just for them.

He aims to train dogs in the schools and for students to play around them in school by a specially designed program called 'K9 etiquettes' for school.

He shared how playing with dogs is a great way to burst stress and an escape from reality. He broke many stereotypes surrounding dogs and urged viewers to behave nicely even if one doesn't like them. He experienced how his own mother doesn't like dogs yet encouraged him towards pursuing this path.

His cheerful way of interaction with the viewers truly mesmerized and instilled a thirst to visit 'K9 – dog resort' one day!

Anurag Salunke was the speaker for the 6th episode of BaatCheet - an interactive interview session held digitally on Instagram live. He was a multi talented individual, experienced in fields like psychology, soft skills development and body language. The session started with him telling us about the broader definitions of the things he practiced, namely oneirology, being a body language specialist and a soft skills trainer. He introduced us to some 'hacks' to work on those particular skills.

Further, the topic of 'mental health' was discussed in detail. From the basics of mental health to the societal approach towards mental health, Anurag enlightened us on a lot of points which were previously unknown to us. He reasoned how, for people suffering from mental inhibitions, talking was a huge part of the process towards getting better. Some of the misconceptions about mental health were also brought forth in this session.

To conclude, Anurag told us how he was able to do so many things at once, and how if you're interested in something, it will never feel like work. It was an overall enlightening session and it was concluded by reciting a poem that the Literary Team prepared for the speaker



She also stated that it is very important for everyone to put oneself first because if you are hale and hearty, your happiness boils down to people around you. 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### **Event Description**

This year the TEDx team of SIESGST held a virtual event for the very first time in the history of SIESGST. The event consisted of 8 speakers and 3 performers from various walks of life. The entire event was premiered live on the official YouTube channel of SIESGST and the event could be viewed by anyone who wishes to. The event kicked off with Harsh Agrawal (member of the core team) welcoming the audience and introducing our very first speaker Rahul Bhatnagar who inspired and motivated the audience with his work ethics and encouraged us to do the same. He was followed by Prof Urmi Chakravorty who discussed about various impacts on the education sector due to the ongoing pandemic and how online education has become a new normal in this world. To light up the event we received a beautiful singing performance by Shubham J who delivered his self-composed song. She has post graduate degrees in Women's Studies, Business Studies and Fine Arts. She has also completed an M.Phil in Women's Studies and is currently pursuing her PhD in Women's Studies from the Advanced Centre for Women's Studies, Tata Institute of Social Sciences, Mumbai. She was awarded the Best Student Prize (2015-2016) and the Institute Gold Medal (2015-2017) for academic performance in M.A in Women's Studies by TISS. She has published academic papers in reputed journals and presented papers in both national and international conferences. Most recently, she has published a paper on "Gender in Disaster Settings" in the United Nation Encyclopaedia for Sustainable Development Goals.


The seminar commenced with her explaining about the idea of empowerment. Further she explained how a lot of board toppers are girls but that does not reflect in the job market and this is due to cultural expectations of women as homemakers and extreme intra-household inequalities. Then she explained what feminization of poverty is, how women perform 66% of the work but only earn 10% of the income. Further she told the audience how the pandemic has disrupted women's lives with an increase in the number of domestic violence cases.





This was followed by the problem statement selection where teams have to select the problem statement of their choice and brainstorming session by the participants. We also had Alumni mentors who were present






to help and guide the participants in all possible ways and to solve their queries.

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#### **Event Description**

The FE induction program is a yearly session conducted by SIES GST where the faculty and the students interact with the new batch of students to familiarize them with the college. FE induction 2021 was held online on Microsoft Teams and saw active participation from students.

#### Day 1:

The first day of FE induction started with a brief introduction about the program, with the principal, Head of Departments and the dean of FE addressing the students. This was followed by a speaker session by Mr Tejas Hoskatti. An hour long break was then observed for the students to have refreshments and come back with a fresh mind. Post break, a speaker session was conducted, where Mr Saurabh Prabhu, an alumni of SIES GST enlightened our students about the various things related to college life and further. To conclude day 1, the workings and teams of the Student Council of SIES GST were introduced to the students, and their queries related to the working of the council were answered.

#### Day 2:

Day 2 started with a Yoga session organized by the NSS Team of SIES GST. It was very energizing and refreshing.Mr. Umesh Jadhav conducted a session on "Universal Human Values".He is western region coordinator for UHV and member of NCC-IP for AICTE and he discussed with students the right understanding of happiness through the process of self exploration. The english proficiency test was conducted and FEs emerged with outstanding scores. Mr. Omkar Prabhu - our alumnus is a Software Engineer at Eastern Enterprise, he established and worked on several initiatives like SIESGSTarena Platform, CodeChef Campus Chapter, ACM ICPC Team from SIES GST. He engaged with the FEs and talked about his experiences. The FEs then adjourned for a break. After the break the council and student chapters had various activities planned for the FEs.

The technical team conducted a session about ABCs of technical which gave the students a glimpse of various technical fields. In the blockchain section, they tried and explained blockchain in depth, so that students are aware and keep track of the latest advancement in this technology. Hacking was also explained.

The Literary Team had planned a variety of activities for the FE Induction programme. The Team began the session by introducing all the events conducted by the team. To lighten up their mood and to freshen the FEs, a number of games and icebreakers were played. After all the fun games, the team explained to the FEs, all about the 'mock parliament.' A mock parliament was conducted. Interesting topics like 'India's data protection policies', 'The new education system of India', etc were discussed.

CSI, the student chapter, covered the basics of Cyber Security and gave a brief idea of how cyber security works and its importance. The important CIA Triads and CTF were also covered. The event

The Design team conducted the workshop on The Basics Of Designing, Color Variations and a Short Introduction to Corel Draw, Photoshop And Illustrator. We also provided a short tutorial about how we can design easily using these softwares. The students were given a brief knowledge about how the student council design team works and showed them some of the posters and certificates made by the team.

IEEE, the student chapter, was able to portray the benefits of MTTS and WiE subchapters. A glimpse of the different events conducted by the student chapter were also highlighted. Further a short introduction to Machine Learning and Artificial Intelligence which developed their curiosity. A small game and a face mask detection project were shown to the students.

The Cultural Team conducted a session to introduce the FE's to the team and its workings. A brief presentation of the events that come under the cultural team was shown to the students.. All five cultural clubs (Aagmi, Aarambh, Aaroha, Fashion Show and Moksh) gave a brief introduction of themselves and what they do, along with their achievements and a short video of their performances. The session ended with a small karaoke session.

The Creative Team of SIES GST conducted an origami concourse obeyed by a mandala session for the initial two days. On the last day, we arranged an origami and a doodle art concourse. Immensely enthusiastic fresher's shared their unique artworks with us, which we featured on our creative team's page to encourage and appreciate their initiatives.

#### Day 3:

Similar to the previous day, day 3 began with a Yoga session conducted by the NSS. Next up was a speaker session by Mr Vishal Vinod. He completed his Master of Business, Entrepreneurship and Technology (MBET) at the University of Waterloo and has an undergraduate degree in mechanical engineering from India. Vishal is currently building a culture of innovation and startups at the DFZ. Another speaker session was arranged for all FEs. Mr. Saurabh Sinha is a serial social entrepreneur and has a degree in Electrical Engineering from Sardar Patel College of Engineering and has a work experience of over 18 years that spans manufacturing and e-commerce. He talked to the FEs regarding e-commerce, merchandising. Digital marketing and many more such topics.

The Literary Team organized a Resume Building Workshop to teach them the nitty-gritty of building an effective resume. Students were explained what a resume is, why it is needed and the importance of a good resume. The students were asked to build a resume of their favorite character or object. They submitted their resumes through online forms. All the resumes submitted by the students were very creative. The most attractive resumes were displayed and read in front of everyone. The workshop received active participation from the students in which they got to learn new things and also enjoyed at the same time.



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The session conducted by the technical team started with explaining the basics to the students followed by 2 activities (activity 1- create connotative image, activity 2- think of automating any gadget). Ascii was explained followed by activity regarding the same. After an overall experience students were able to think creatively in a new direction or add some new perspective to them. Throughout the rest of the day, other teams and student chapters conducted their respective sessions.

#### Day 4:

The day yet again started with an energizing Yoga session by the NSS team. The first session for the day was of UHV. The universal human values session was conducted by DR. Mohan Rao who is currently a member of UHV Cell of Mumbai University. He is not only an Electrical Engineer from BITS—Pilani, PGMSM from Delhi University but also with IES Management College and research centre in mumbai as professor and associate Dean. He talked about various important human values that will be helpful for the FEs.

After this session, a maths proficiency test was conducted and FEs emerged with outstanding scores. After a short break, the FEs resumed their sessions with various activities by the cultural team, creative team, design team, literary team, IEEE student chapter as well as CSI.

In the session conducted by the technical team, students got to know about what is gamedev, role of gamedev and interaction took place to know favorite games, elements of game and various game terms. Students were briefly explained how to make a game. This ended with technical questions and showcasing work. Throughout the rest of the day, other teams and student chapters conducted their respective sessions.

#### Day 5:

An alumni session was conducted by Kratika Kaushal. She is currently working as a quantitative analyst in a private fund management company in Melbourne for over 2 years. She shared her college experience and importance of the student council.

The next session was by the speaker Ms. Harshada Patil. She is a POSH Consultant and External member for many leading companies. She said that workplace sexual harassment is a form of gender discrimination which violates a women's fundamental right to equality. Further she explained different scenarios and examples that came forward in her career. She also told the students about the internal complaints committee.

The FEs were then introduced to the Media Team of SIES GST. We first went through the basics of photography, explaining the most important rule of thirds, with the exposure triangle to explain the basic rules to follow when taking a good photo. The media team showed their various works including the TML movies. In the end a question and answer session was also held by the team



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where the first years would ask various questions regarding the team, or how to be a part of the media team.

The technical team conducted a session in which students were addressed by the technical heads to give them insight of what the technical team of SIESGST has achieved so far. Technical heads from various technical domains explained to students about their domains like app development, web development and machine learning.

The Sports Team of SIES GST started off by giving a powerpoint presentation regarding our teams. The students got to know about our main event, LAKSHYA. Introduction of our online event 2fit2quit was given as well. After the introduction of our Sports Team an inspirational session was held by our Sports Secretary Mrunal Sarang. We concluded the session by keeping a short Q&A session.

The students were introduced to SAE INDIA. They were introduced to the various competitions organized by SAE India such as baja, gkdc, supra and aero design. 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
### **Event Description**

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
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




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






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# Summary:


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
### **Event Description**



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










# **Event Description**

WDC SIESGST conducted a seminar on December 21s t, 2020 at 11:00am on virtual grounds via the Microsoft Teams App.

The speaker for the seminar was Ms. Lavanya Shanbhogue. She currently teaches gender and forms of social vulnerability at the Centre for Disasters and Development, Jamsetji Tata School of Disaster Studies, Tata Institute of Social Sciences, Mumbai. She has post graduate degrees in Women's Studies, Business

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Studies and Fine Arts. She has also completed an M.Phil in Women's Studies and is currently pursuing her PhD in Women's Studies from the Advanced Centre for Women's Studies, Tata Institute of Social Sciences, Mumbai.She was awarded the Best Student Prize (2015-2016) and the Institute Gold Medal (2015-2017) for academic performance in M.A in Women's Studies by TISS. She has published academic papers in reputed journals and presented papers in both national and international conferences. Most recently, she has published a paper on "Gender in Disaster Settings" in the United Nation Encyclopaedia for Sustainable Development Goals.

The seminar commenced with her explaining about the idea of empowerment. Further she explained how a lot of board toppers are girls but that does not reflect in the job market and this is due to cultural expectations of women as homemakers and extreme intra-household inequalities. Then she explained what feminization of poverty is, how women perform 66% of the work but only earn 10% of the income. Further she told the audience how the pandemic has disrupted women's lives with an increase in the number of domestic violence cases.

Towards the end, she explained what women can do to recognize the problems faced by them, create awareness about these problems and participate fully in the cause. The seminar ended with an interactive question and answer session.

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










# Disaster management workshop - 23/01/2021

INTRO: The NSS unit of SIES GST conducted a disaster management workshop on 23/01/2021 (Saturday) from 10 AM to 12:40 PM. The workshop was conducted by Mr. Mohammad Faizan, who is the founder of Social Architect Foundation and Mr. Harshad Patil, secretary at Social Architect foundation.

Social Architect Foundation aim to provide upliftment of society by engaging youth in Nation Development. They had around 3000 students and Professionals and children trained under our Disaster management training across Mumbai, Thane and Raigad.

The workshop started with the opening ceremony by Dr. Manasi Karkare, dean, first year engineering at SIES GST and then introduction of our guests by Mr. Kedar Sant, TE Volunteer of NSS. The volunteers were then divided into two groups for effective practice. The following activities were included in the workshop:

- 1. Explanation on the when, why and what of CPR, the technique by which CPR is given and the things to follow. This was then followed by volunteers practically doing pre-CPR actions.
- 2. Immediate reactions for Hand injury, Head injury, Leg injury and eye injury.
- 3. Mobilization techniques such as two-hand, three-hand and four-hand positions, making a stretcher with sticks and sheet, sticks and rope, etc.

The session ended with Vote of thanks and a group photo














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# Republic Day -26/01/2021

But this year the day saw the numbers of attendees reduced because of COVID restrictions. So this event was live telecasted on Google meet for Students and faculties who weren't able to attend it.





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# Support Our Strays -21/01/2021 to 28/02/2021

### INTRO:

We looked into the issue of crippling situation of strays and their hardships for survival due to the pandemic situation.

This pandemic has affected stray animals and birds equally or even worse than what it did to us which we could clearly see around us.

We decided to help these poor souls around us in any possible way we could.

This initiative led to our campaign - SUPPORT OUR STRAYS, in which we started feeding strays around us, provide them shelter and then publicized our campaign to inspire people to do the same.

The response to this was immense and our solution was a success as it grew willingness and awareness among people to support our strays.

### PROBLEM STATEMENT:

Many strays and birds during the lockdown faced severe shortage of food because of less interference of humans at the public places and streets.

Due to this, a lot of dogs and cats in our streets were suffering from malnutrition.



Also, the birds were losing shelters due to the large-scale cutting of trees in urban areas. Leading to almost minimal or no visibility of birds near our residences.

There was a need of maintaining the balance of our ecosystem and keeping up with the life chain.

#### **SOLUTION & IMPLEMENTATION:**

To tackle this crisis, we came up with the solutions including feeding stray animals, birds and our own publicity campaigns to spread awareness.

We created different types of bird feeders and installed it in our vicinity. After tracking the insights for a week, we selected the bird feeder that works according to our surroundings and continued to keep it sustainable. For dogs and cats, we continued to feed them on daily basis.

After we implemented this solutions, we decided to encourage others because the campaign would be more stronger when there would be more people on board.

We created impactful posters with messages including helpful information, to directly connect with the people and help them take the action instantaneously.

We also created a short-reel video for our campaign on Instagram.

And we will keep continuing this activity and keep inspiring more people from our learnings of this activity-based project.

#### **IMPACT ANALYSIS:**

On this journey, more than hundred people joined us in feeding the strays daily and helping them survive the crisis.

We received more than 80 pictures personally of people feeding the strays and creating bird feeders.


Through our publicity campaigns, we reached over 5000 people in a single day through social media. Our reel video also crossed 4000 views so far and still counting.


They also helped us to reach more people by putting their pictures on their WhatsApp and Instagram accounts, tagging our @nss\_siesgst handle.










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#### OPEN LIBRARY-21/01/2021 to 28/02/2021

INTRODUCTION: We have setup an NSS SIESGST OPEN LIBRARY where students get the opportunity to get free books for studying and preparing for the their examinations. We have targeted the students from class 9<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> and also for the ones who are preparing for entrance, particularly for JEE, NEET and MHCET examinations. Our goal is to reach out to the ones who cannot afford to buy books and strive hard for their success.

We want our LIBRARY to reach out to the underprivileged and somehow be able to help them achieve their dreams.

**PROBLEM STATEMENT:** There are many underprivileged children who cannot afford books, for boards and competitive exams, around our locality which becomes a hindrance in their education due to lack of resources. This condition worsened during Covid-19 and made it difficult for these children to even ask for help from others. This is why we the volunteers of NSS unit of SIES GST took an initiative to help them by providing books for free.

#### **SOLUTION & IMPLEMENTATION:**

So we decided that if we can provide books for this students free of cost it will solve their problem. Hence we came with a plan of library which means providing books to a student for a time limit of 3 weeks

Implementation steps:

- 1. First we prepared all the publicity posters, messages and the spreadsheets on which we were going to keep tracks of total books, donors and receivers.
- 2) Then we started our donor's publicity so that we can get a sufficient amount of books for our library. We forwarded all our posters, messages through whatsapp groups and Insta stories.
- 3)After getting sufficient amount of books we started with publicity for the receivers through both online and offline medium

**IMPACT ANALYSIS**: In this project many individuals have also come forward and donated books from standard 9-12 and books for entrance exams for the underprivileged children.

The drive which was held by nss unit by doing online publicity using posters in social media which has helped in collecting many books for the open library at each location mentioned earlier with a total number of 1,197 books from 91 donors.



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





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# Menstrual hygiene awareness and Sex education 21/01/2021 to 28/02/2021

**INTRO:** We the volunteers of the NSS Unit of SIES GST have taken the initiative to bring attention to the need for proper menstrual hygiene and sex education that the youth of our nation deserves, and to donate sanitary pads to underprivileged girls, to provide them with the basic sanitation they need.

PROBLEM STATEMENT: To spread awareness about Sex Education and Menstrual Hygiene amongst the people. The reason behind choosing this topic was that we felt there is a lack of awareness about Sex Education and Menstruation in our Country. People usually avoid discussing these things with their parents, friends, etc because of the barrier which is set up by our society. In order to remove this barrier and promote an environment where people can freely talk about their problems, we are working on this project. Secondly, after pretty good research, we came to know that many women in our country don't use sanitary pads. Thus to promote the use of sanitary pads we also decided to conduct a donation drive so that we could distribute them amongst the needy.

**SOLUTION & IMPLEMENTATION:** On 20th January 2021, we started discussing ideas with each other and came to the conclusion of Conducting an Online survey through which we would get people's perspectives on Sex Education and Menstruation Hygiene. Once the survey got over we started studying the responses to the survey form and decided to make Videos and Posts which we would upload on our Instagram Page.

Hence on 12th February 2021, we created our Instagram Page and made the Survey Form available for everyone. We publicized our Survey form as well as our Instagram page through

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various platforms like Instagram and WhatsApp. We also made a Publicity Video to make people understand our motto and support us in our project. The publicity overall went very well and we started making our first Instagram Post which we posted on 22nd February. Meanwhile, as the publicity was going on we distributed ourselves in groups and assigned specific tasks to each other. Half of the team was divided to look after Instagram Posts and content while the other half started looking for cheap sanitary pads and the location where we could conduct our Donation Drive. We found some really cheap sanitary pads which were certified and safe to use.

Regarding the donation drive, we were able to find an Ashram where we could conduct our donation drive.

Immediately, we started collecting the funds using UPI transactions and to publicize the drive we made a video which started publicizing it through WhatsApp and Instagram Forwards and Stories. In a very few hours, we collected the target amount.

On 28th Feb 2021 we went to the Ashram and began with our Session which basically covered What is Menstruation?, Why is Menstrual Hygiene necessary?, Proper disposal of Sanitary Pads and, also a demonstration on how to use them. Followed by our session was our Sanitary pads distribution. This is how we conducted our project and plan to continue doing the same.

IMPACT ANALYSIS: The online survey which we conducted received 377 responses. We studied them thoroughly and took further steps. Also, we were able to gather 199 followers on our Instagram page and our videos received more than 1500 views. Our WhatsApp shares also influenced many people. We even received many suggestions on our future posts.

Speaking about the donation drive we decided to set a target of Rs 1500 which we collected in very few hours. Our first donation drive required us to spend Rs 200. We bought 50 packs of Sanitary pads consisting of 4 pads each and distributed 5 packs to each girl among 10 girls.

This activity also had a very good impact on us, the NSS Volunteers, as it taught us many things in the process like how to communicate and speak to various people, collecting precise information regarding a specific topic, and many more. We thus accomplished the requirements of our project and plan to continue making it better.

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

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#### Teaching slum children

#### 21/01/2021 to 28/02/2021

INTRO: The NSS Volunteers of SIES GST took an initiative to teach the underprivileged students in slum area. As we know due to the covid – 19 pandemic education was done through online mode. But as all people in slum do not have privilege of using mobile phones, so students were not able to join the lectures which were conducted by their schools. So we decided to provide the kids with basic education for the period of one month and at the end of this period we were able to see the positive change.

**PROBLEM STATEMENT:** To provide basic education for underprivileged students in slum area .This topic was decided considering the recent churn of events- due to Covid -19 pandemic all the schools and colleges are closed. Even though the government has started to teach the students through online medium, but in these slum areas, not all students are having the privilege of using mobile phones, so students were not able to join the lectures which were conducted by their schools. The 2nd major point was- many students don't even go to school as a result of that- they don't have a basic knowledge.

So our main aim was to teach all the children and provide them with basic education.

#### **SOLUTION & IMPLEMENTATION:**

We started the implementation from 30 January 2021

#### Week1

We asked all the students to introduce themselves. A separate record was maintained which contained name and standards of the students who were attending our drive. 30 students were present on Day1. Our motive was to interact with the students, to know in which language they

Next day, The kids were initially divided into two groups

Below std 4th- (A small activity on ascending and descending numbers was conducted)

Std 4<sup>th</sup> and above-(Multiplication and Addition were our main focus for this group.)

(We collected contacts of students who had WhatsApp for further communication)

#### Week2

For students above 4th std:

Addition and Subtraction of 2 digit numbers were taught. Multiplication i.e tables from 2-8 were taught. Addition of 3 digit numbers. Subtraction of 2 digit numbers. Multiplication of 2 digit numbers. Subtraction borrowing sums. Tables from 1 to 9 were taught.

For students from kg to 4th std:

Capital alphabets - ABC...Z, Numbers from 1-80. Then a Small activity called Simon says a has been conducted for all students to get an idea of body parts and sensory organsi.e eyes, nose, etc.

#### Week3

We divided the children into 4 groups as follows:

Group 1: Children who can read and write words and can understand basic sentence -formation

Group 2: Children who can write ABCD but don't know word-formation.

Group 3: Children who can identify ABCD but need more practice

Group 4: Children who can not even identify ABCD

In group 1, they were revised with word and sentence formation and given multiplication-related problems.

For group 2, we taught 1-50 digits and spelling related to the topic - My introduction.

For group 3, we made them practice capital alphabets A-Z.

For group 4, we taught them from start A-Z (i.e. A for apple and so on) on white board.

#### Week4

Group 1

Homework was checked, and we took their revision. Meaning of some English words and multiplication. Multiplication problems were given to the students and as they were able to solve them, Division was introduced. Also, some students were taught sentences in English.

Group 2

Revision of A-Z capital and small letters was done .Numbers 1-50 (with spellings). The homework done by the students was checked and numbers from 1 to 100 were also taught.

Capital and small letter A-Z .1-10 writing with spellings was taught

Activity:

We gave craft paper to all students and taught them how to make a boat

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Group 1 and 2 were taught to make fish from craft paper and students from groups 3 and 4 were taught to make a purse from craft paper.

#### Week 5

Group 1: Multiplication, Division, Book reading was taught to the students

Group 2: Addition (3 digit), Subtraction (2 digit) with borrow, Multiplication (2 x 1 digit) were taught

Group 3 & 4: Basic A-Z were taught

#### Activity -

Group 1 and 2

For this group we played a number game, in which students we able to revise the concept of tables

Group 3 n 4

Maze game was conducted for this group, in which they were able to identify A to Z in proper order

Balloon race

This was a fun activity conducted for kids to enjoy.

#### **IMPACT ANALYSIS:**

During our initial sessions, students were so playful and were having an attitude like they don't want to study. As we got to know that they like playing, we selected each and every activity accordingly so that it will also help them to study and also in a playful manner, and our strategy worked very well according to our plan as the students started interacting and started studying properly as we said them we'll play and conduct activities at the end of each session. In this way the students got involved. And after forming groups according to their capability; the students got motivated and started studying hard to get into higher group. And also as a part of cleanliness, the students were not following the precautions and sanitization while coming to attend session, so we started washing their hands before each session starts which also made an good impact in their hygiene. At the beginning of the sessions they were not even clear with their basic knowledge but at the end of our activity we can assure that their basics are clear.

Users can also check locations available for tree plantation uploaded by other users along with the location link (from google maps) and contact information of certain authorities if needed.

#### PROBLEM STATEMENT:

We realized that it is very difficult to find all the necessary information required for tree plantation at home or by yourself. The trees planted with incomplete information might lead in burning of the seeds or saplings. Also If you want to plant the tree outside you need to find a proper location and in some cases you need to get permission from certain authorities. After a few discussions, we came to the conclusion that a website might be the best solution for these problems.

#### **SOLUTION & IMPLEMENTATION:**

It came to our mind that a Website is the best solution to our problem. As it is something that is very Mobile and can be accessed by each and everyone. Our website contains information (Size, Life cycle, Climate, Soil, Watering/Care, Uses) about a few popular plants grown in India, Along with information of some gardening tools which might be required while plantation. Through our website, users can create an event for tree plantation at any location convenient to them. Other users can register for these events. This feature is useful during current pandemic time, since we'll have a rough number of people participating in the event. Users can also add/check locations available for tree plantation along with the location link (from google maps)

All the group members have gained experience in web development, and are now familiar with complex concepts of HTML, CSS, Django.

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
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

This Interactive Session was conducted on Zoom.


After the session there was a Question and Answer session.

Along with that NSS volunteers created Various Activities to create awareness. This included Quiz, Posters Videos.




















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#### MANGROVE CLEANING – 13/02/2021


















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#### SHIVAJI JAYANTI- 19/02/2021

This program was conducted on Google Meet for all the volunteers and faculty members.



#### WDC Annual Report 2020-21

The CWDC (College Women Development Cell) has been set up as per the guidelines laid down by the women development cell of University of Mumbai. CWDC conducts various programs and workshops to create social awareness in students about women related issues. The cell looks into the grievances of the women, both staff and students, and provides guidance and help to them.

The following events have been organised under WDC for the year 2020-21

22<sup>nd</sup> January 2021: Webinar on 'Prevention of Sexual Harassment (POSH) law' was conducted on 22 January 2021 by Ms. Harshada Patil at 11:00 am on virtual grounds via the Microsoft Teams App. She is a POSH Consultant and External member for many leading companies. She is an experienced professional with 39 years of work experience in the social sector. She is also a CSR expert and personal counsellor.

She commenced the seminar by infoming all the students about the POSH ACT. This Act was enacted by the Ministry of Women & Child Development of India in 2013 which is an extension of the Vishakha Guidelines issued by the Supreme Court in 1997. Ms Harshada Patil said that workplace sexual harassment is a form of gender discrimination which violates a women's fundamental right to equality. She informed that as women are entering the workforce in increasing numbers their rights have to be respected and protected. She also stressed on the need of this law in contemporary times, responsibility of employers, employees to create a healthy environment at the workplace to achieve gender sensitization. Further she explained different scenarios and examples that came forward in her career. She also told the students about the internal complaints committee.

The session concluded with an interactive question and answer session. All students liked the guidelines and suggestions given by the speaker which was attended by around 154 students (especially FE students) and faculties.

8th March 2021: On the eve of Women day webinar on "Empowering Women through Health Awareness" was conducted on 8 March 2021 by Mrs. Namita Sharma for all women including faculty, non teaching staff, housekeeping staff, security staff and students. She is a Fitness Expert with more than 14 years of experience in this field. She is also the owner of Fitness club. When women champion her health, she empower herself physically, mentally and emotionally. Empowerment also flows from awareness, which can lead to positive action.

She discussed the current pandemic situation, working from home, managing the house simultaneously without additional support. Generally women keep her health as the last priority as compared to the health of children, husband and other elders. How to give priority of own health, good eating habits, regular exercising. She also discussed bad habits like omitting breakfast and overeating, how to prevent it. General health problems, acidity, stress and how to tackle them or prevent them.

She also discussed constructive time utilization and discipline for improving health as well as quality of life. How to continue good habits and good lifestyle, how to inculeate them in daily patterns.

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The session concluded with an interactive question and answer session. All attendees liked the guidelines and suggestions given by the speaker which was attended by around 61 non teaching staff and faculties.

12th March 2021: Webinar on 'Laws Related to Women' was conducted on 12th March 2021 by Ms. Arya Raje at 4pm on virtual grounds via the Microsoft Teams App. She did her LLB from ILS Law College, Pune, and an LLM from UCLA School of Law. She practised in the Bombay High Court as a human rights and public interest lawyer, including women's rights, after which she did an MPhil from Tata Institute of Social Sciences.

She commenced the seminar by discussing how women issues are different than others and why might women require different protection laws. She also explained substantive laws and procedural laws. Laws against decrimination i.e article 14 and article 15 i.e equality under constitution. After this she also discussed in brief regarding criminal offences against women POCSO, Section 354.A,354B,354C and 354D-assault or criminal force to women in intend to outrage her modesty. Procedural laws in case of sexual assault. Speaker also explained procedure, documentation, lodging of FIR for criminal offencess. If police are refusing to note down what to do in case of criminal process.

She also discussed provision of sexual harassment act for working women POSH and for students UGC regulations to protect students from sexual harassment on campus- unwanted sexual remarks or conduct. Procedure of registering complaint in ICC and related laws.

Advocate Arya also discussed important laws related to Cyber Crimes and legal procedure.

The session concluded with an interactive question and answer session. All students liked the guidelines and suggestions given by the speaker which was attended by around 61 students and faculties.

15 March 2021- Intercollegiate poster making competition Forza TML2021 was conducted on 15th March by Women Development Cell of SIESGST in collaboration with the IEEE SIESGST under its sub-chapter WiE initiated this intriguing event "FORZA" with means to provide the part-takers with a platform to express their creative side while upholstering the current scenario of the pandemic, aiming to acknowledge and appreciate the efforts taken by the Covid 19 frontline warriors.

Topics selected for poster making were Women frontline workers, pregnancy during COVID, Unemployment due to covid, Domestic issues due to Covidetc. The posters were examined based on their relevance to the topic, content, design and their neoteric quality. All the part-takers tried their best hand at conveying the theme of their topic through thought out posters.

This year WDC brought positive changes and the efforts and the hard work put behind each event was clearly visible. The cell hopes to bring many progressive changes for women and promises to keep working to bring about a positive change in the society.



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#### **Event Description**

Literary Festival of Performing Arts was a 3 day long Literary festival organized by The Literary Team of Student Council SIES GST, staging some of the most vibrant voices, poets, story tellers, lyricists, stand up comedians and musicians to move the audience with joy and let them experience the vibration of echoes of India through this festive celebration.

Day 1: The Literary Festival of Performing Arts began with the opening ceremony on 2nd April. The host began the ceremony with the poem 'Daffodil', beautiful words of William Wordsworth flared new energy among the crowd. After the recitation of the poem and a warm welcome to everyone, Mrs. Sumitra Padmanabhan, student council in charge, inaugurated LFPA. She showered kind words and praises for being able to conduct such a festival in a time of crisis. Sumitra ma'am also unveiled Samanvay, the annual college magazine. It was followed by the host giving a rundown of the schedule of the current and following days.

The first competitive event of the Literary Festival of Performing Arts – the Debate competition took place on 2nd of April at 12p.m. through an online platform. Over 30 participants took part in the competition and presented their views on over 20 different topics. The participants were randomly assigned topics like 'Should Celebrities be regarded as Role Models?', 'Is India ready for E-vehicles?', 'A Borderless World—Myth or Reality' and 'Should Sex Education be included in Syllabus of Schools and Colleges', etc. The judges were Mr Akash Menon and Ms Riona Almeida, alumni of our college.

On 2nd of April, we had a meme making contest MEME MANIA. In this competition, students were expected to portray their talent of transmitting laughter through the aid of memes. The theme for the contest was-"The New Normal". The judge for the event was Mr. Sarthak Sharma. The winner and best creative meme was selected by our judge and there was a special people's choice award which was selected on the basis of voting.

The workshop was conducted in a Zoom webinar.


The main points discussed in the webinar was:


- We have well-equipped hospitals and surgeons, but severe scarcity of organs for transplantation

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
### **Breathing Exercise Workshop-30/04/2021**






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#### **Event Description**

Promethean 2021 Round 1 was a presentation competition organized to provide a platform for our budding engineers, the FEs, to come up with modern-day, innovative and effective solutions to existing environmental problems. Round 1 comprised 2 workshops and the main event, as discussed below:

Promethean Workshop 1: 19th-21st April, 2021.

FEs were duly informed of the procedures and regulations of the competition (Registration, Team Criteria, Topic Appendment, PPT Design & Structure, Slide Content, Time Limit). Two to three SE volunteers were appointed per division, who would mentor them thereon throughout the event.
