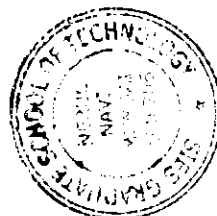


DREAM RUN – 17 MARCH, 2019

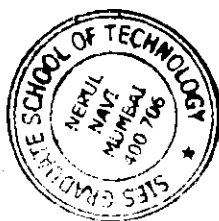


Compost Filtration – 24/2/19

Theme Based Workshop – 20/02/2019-21/02/2019

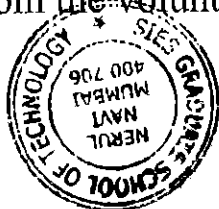
The NSS unit of SIES GST conducted a two day Theme Based Workshop on 'Waste Management' on 20/02/2019 & 21/02/2019. This workshop was a district level workshop in which NSS volunteers from various colleges participated.


The workshop was inaugurated by Prof. B.S. Bidve, NSS programme coordinator of NSS Cell Mumbai University. The resource persons for the workshop were Ms. Rashmi Joshi, Dr. Ramkishan Bhise and Prof. Mrinal Khadse.

The first session on the first day was on solid waste management by Ms. Rashmi Joshi. Various problems regarding solid waste management were explained to the volunteers. Later the solutions were discussed in an interactive session. A homemade waste to compost project was also shown to the volunteers and everyone was encouraged to start such a project in their homes.

After lunch, Ms. Rashmi Joshi took a session on liquid waste management and gave a brief explanation about hazardous waste. The day ended with an interactive question and answer session.

The first session of the second day was conducted by Dr. Ram Bhise. The session was on e-waste. Various issues regarding e-waste were explained and the solutions for these were taken from the volunteers. The session was followed by a




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small activity where volunteers prepared decorative or useful items from waste materials found at home.

After lunch, Prof. Mrinal Khadse conducted a session on plastic waste management. In this session volunteers were asked to list down the items made of plastic that are used daily. After that, the volunteers were asked to identify which items can be reused or recycled and the use of which could be reduced. At last, the volunteers were divided into groups and were given an assignment to identify problems regarding waste management in their locality and provide effective solutions for the same.

At the end, all volunteers were presented with certificates of participation by Dr. Ram Bhise, Prof. Mrinal Khadse and Ms. Rashmi Joshi.

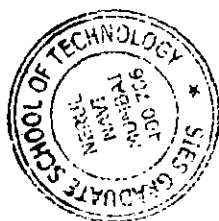


Anveshana Report 2018-19

The engineering students mentored these students in the creation of models while inducing knowledge and confidence in them.

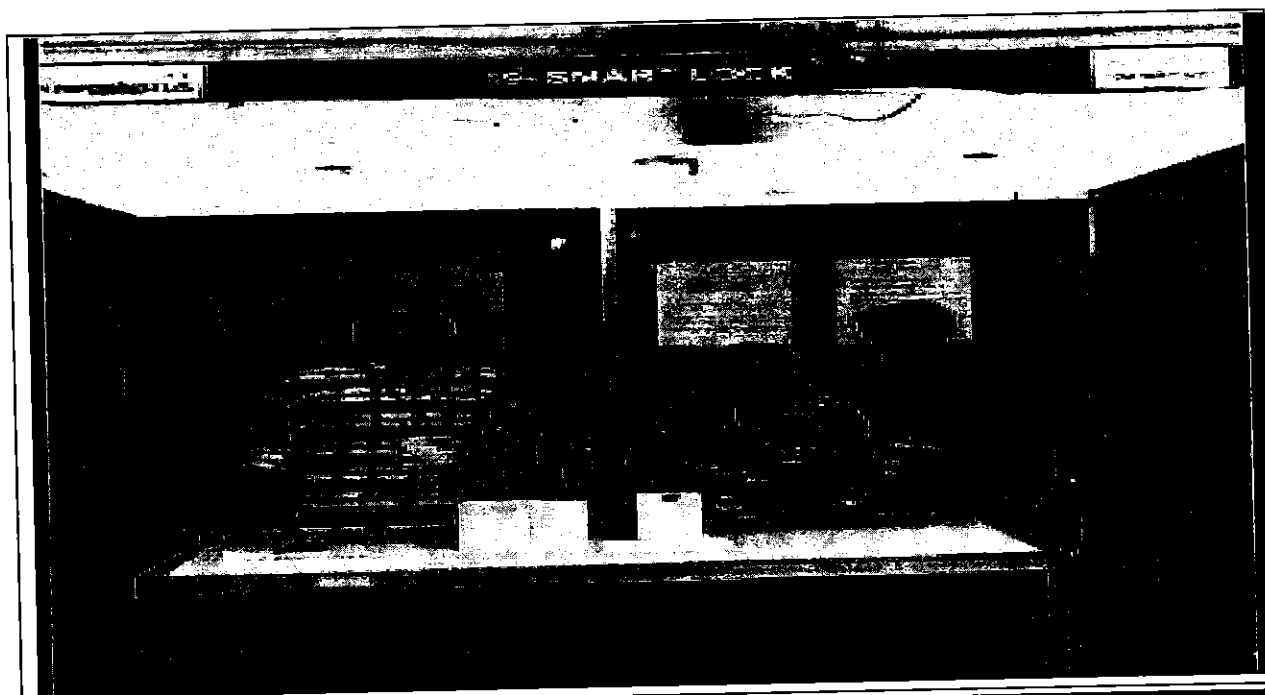
Engineering colleges participated as teams with 2 members. Each team was allotted 2 students from NMMC school-15 located in Nerul to mentor them to design and build models or projects around an identified social problem. The school students thus received exposure to the entire planning, designing and building process of the models and in turn will get educated in the scientific and engineering concepts behind the models in Anveshana.

Their projects were L1BOT, Sky scapper cleaning drone, Smart lock, Auto stove, starting from December 2018 to February 2019. Students made regular visits to school to teach the school kids. Overall it was a great experience for both the school kids as well as the engineering students.

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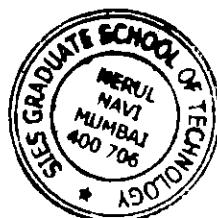
Event Description

(ii) Legalization of Euthanasia

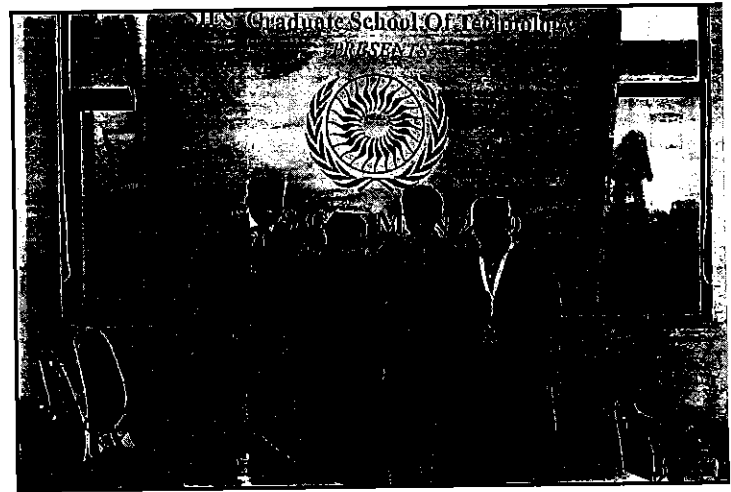

4. Cleanliness and Hygiene

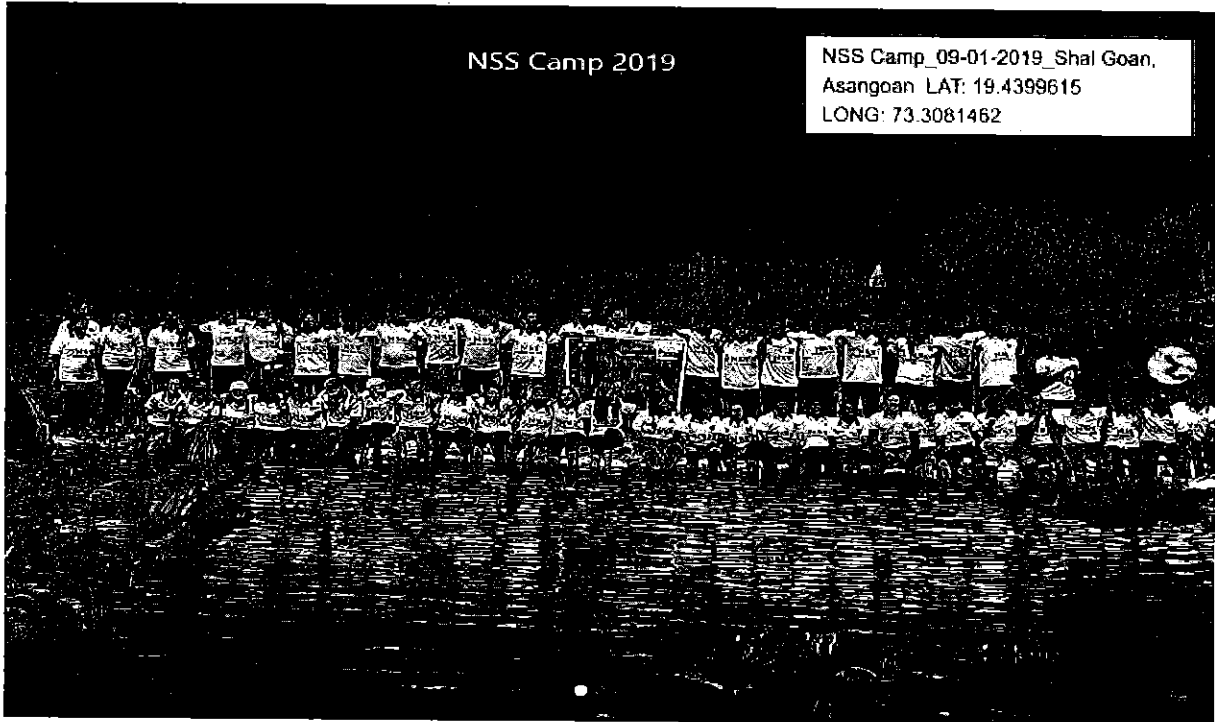

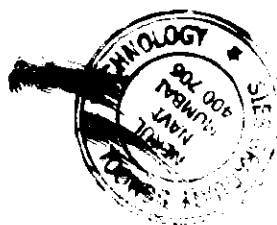
Disaster Management 2

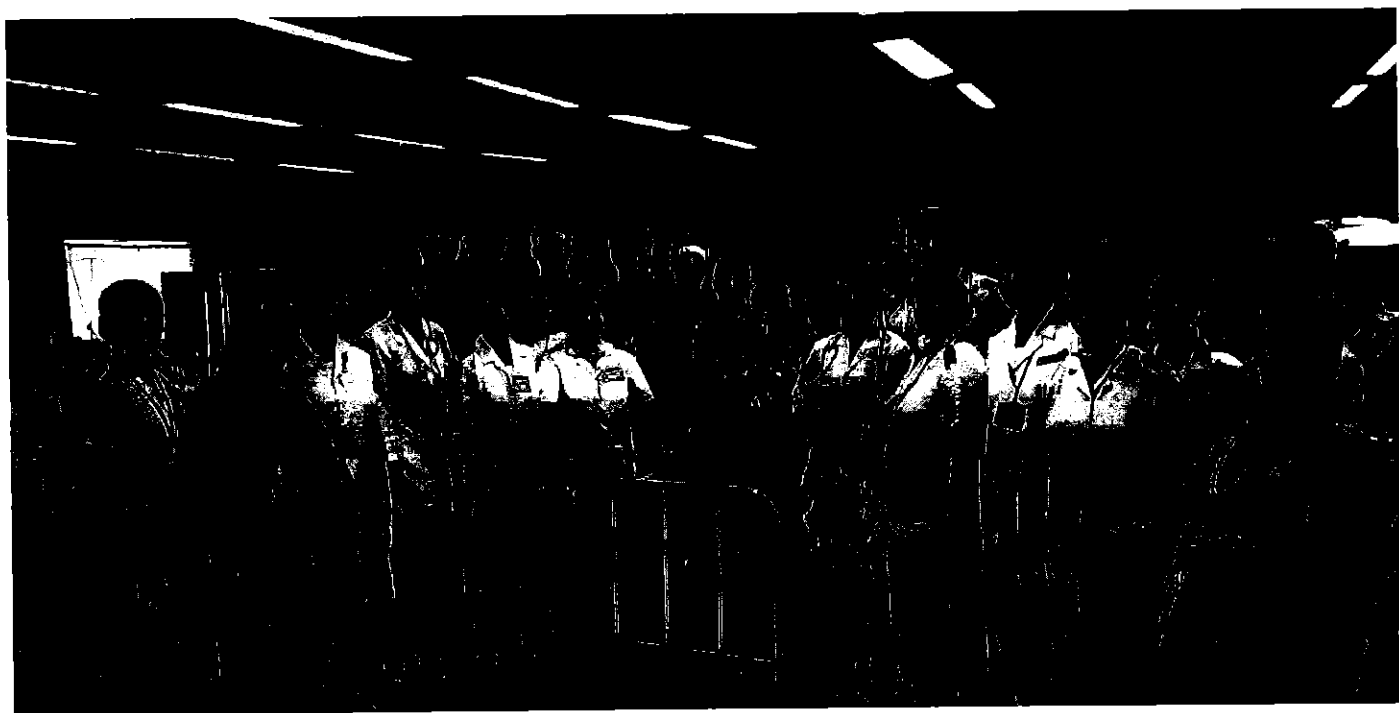



The workshop was initiated by The Municipal Commissioner for Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation, Dr N. Ramaswami in presence of The Additional Municipal Commissioner for the Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation, Mr Ravindra Patil; our Principal Dr. Vikram Patil; the NSS Programme Coordinator for Mumbai University, Prof. B S Bidve; CEO for the Aga Khan Agency for Habitat, Ms. Surekha Ghogale; Project Coordinator for the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), Ms. Vrindhanath; the Head of Emergency Management, Mr. Madhukar Sanap and the NSS Area Coordinator for Navi Mumbai, Dr. Ram Bhise.

On the first day of the workshop, a seminar was conducted on the basic concepts of disaster management. The objective of this seminar was to inculcate in the attendees, an ability to act quickly and responsibly in times of emergency. The attendees of this workshop participated in a demonstration of the use cases of fire extinguishers in case of a fire-related emergency.

The second day of the workshop included specialized training for specific emergencies like earthquakes, urban/forest fires, medical emergencies, etc. Demonstrations and training on the



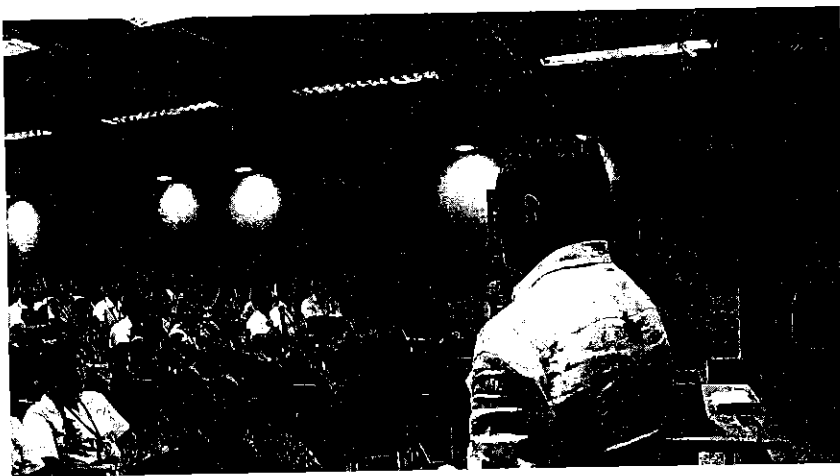
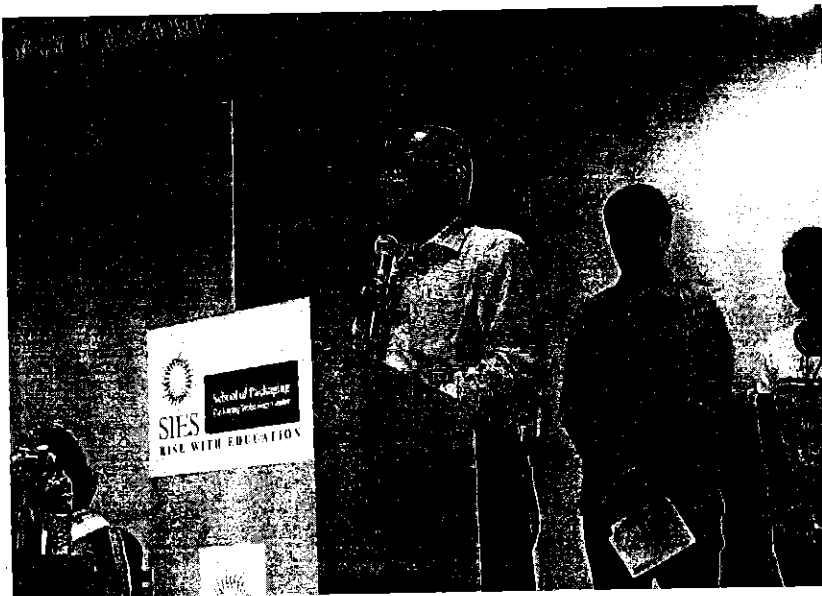

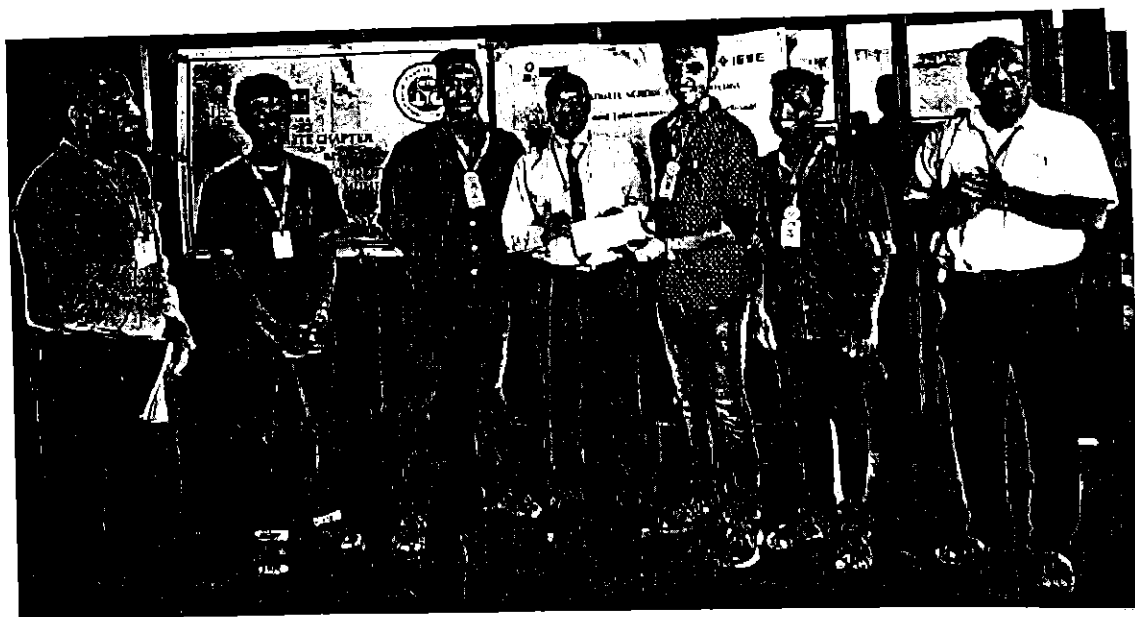


POSTER MAKING COMPETITION HELD BY IEEE SIESGST

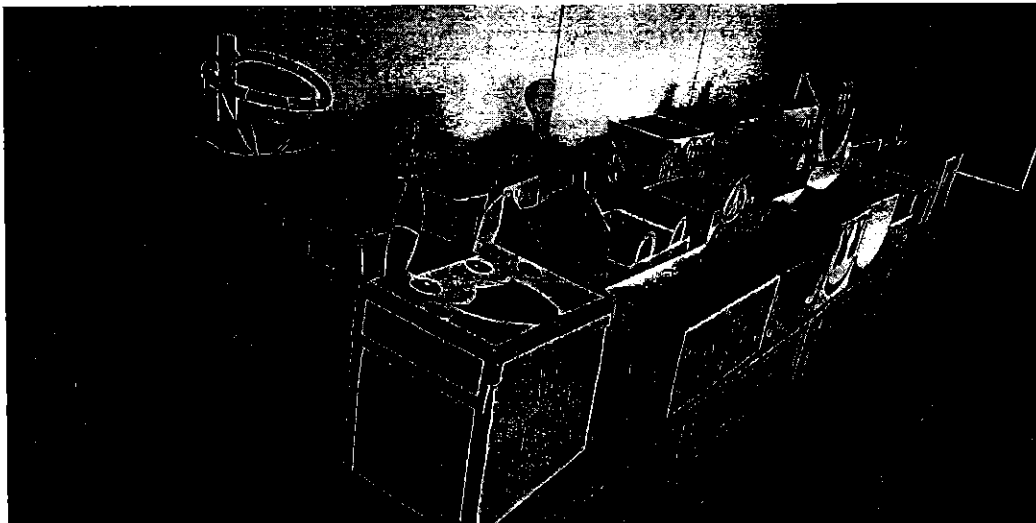
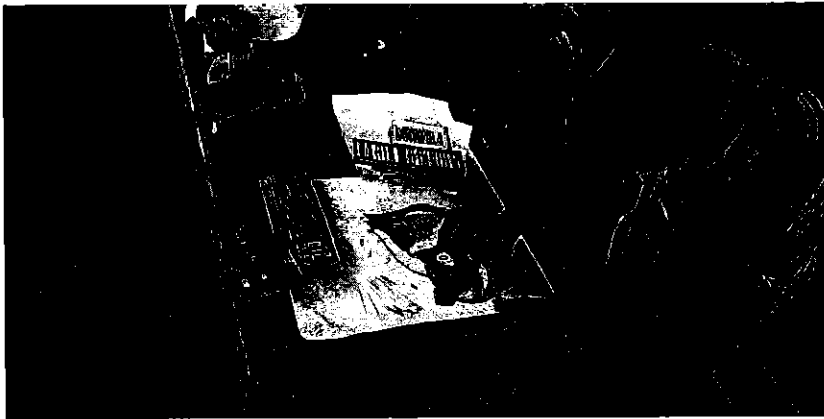
Dustbin making – 2/9/2018

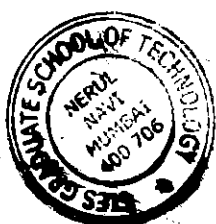
BEACON – An ISR Initiative by SIES GST

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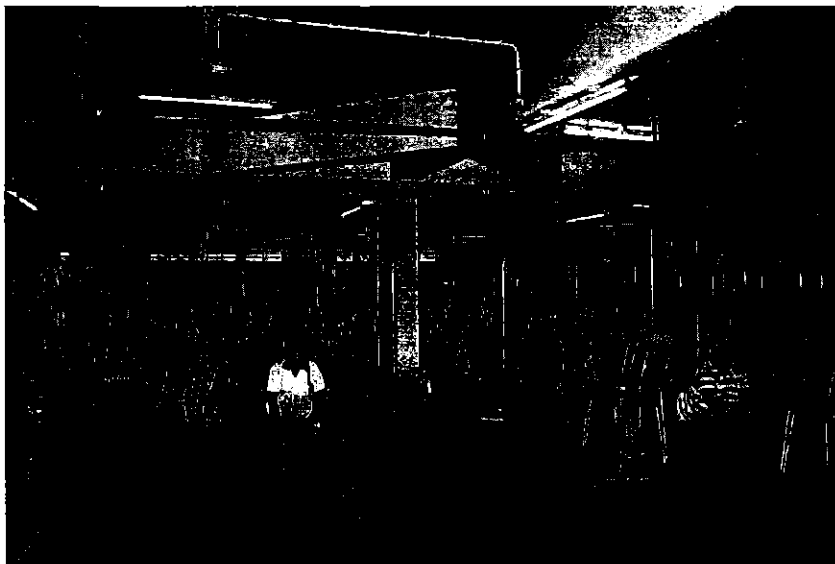
Celebration of International Yoga Day - 21/06/2018
