



The South Indian Education Society has taken a significant step forward by making social

responsibility a part of the education process. It was decided that each college in the group would adopt a village for its overall development and to empower the villagers. The SIES College of Arts, Science & Commerce, Sion West, took the first initiative by adopting a small tribal village in 2013 followed by the SIES College of Management Studies adopting another in 2014. The SIES Graduate School of Technology, Nerul has extended the initiative further by treading a different path. As part of the Institute Social Responsibility initiative taken by the South Indian Education Society, the Graduate School of Technology provides vocational training to the underprivileged sections of the society. The target group is orphans, street children, school dropouts and similar individuals between the age group of 18-30 years.

Beacon offers seven trades, viz Carpentry, Welding, Metal Turning, Sewing & Tailoring, Plumbing, Electrician, Screen Printing and Computer Operator,





each having a course duration of six months including a foundation course for all. The courses focus more on practical hands on training with minimum required theoretical background. Each candidate is further exposed to the basics of grooming, banking skills, computer skills, spoken English, Mathematics, as part of the foundation course. At the end of the training the students are placed with service providers, contractors or in industries for internship. Until now, SIES GST's BEACON has trained 8 batches from 2016 and all of them have been well placed.

Dream Run - 2016

Dream run is an annual marathon which is held for a noble cause every year and this iteration was held on 14th February 2016. Like all the previous iterations, this one also had a specific mission - that was to raise money for the Naam foundation. It was organized by the NSS unit, in collaboration with the Students council and witnessed an active participation from 390 students and 25 teachers, with high morale and enthusiasm from the participants. In addition, a street play was also organized at Nerul station to spread awareness about the initiative.



DREAM RUN - 17 MARCH, 2019

Dream Run is a charitable initiation undertaken by SIES GST in which NSS plays a major role. It is a marathon that is organized every year in the even semester of college.

The NSS unit SIES GST along with Decathlon, Belapur organized a marathon "Dream Run 2019" on 17th March, 2019. This marathon was a fund-raising event for Sunshine Education Society, Vashi which is a non − profitable organization aimed primarily for providing quality education to children with Autism Spectrum Disorder and other developmental disabilities. The marathon had 3 categories namely Joy Run, 5 km marathon and 10 km marathon. There were about 700 participants and ₹1.23 lakh fund was generated by NSS of ₹3.3 lack of total fund, making the event a grand success.














FE Induction - 2019

Sangli, Kolhapur Flood Relief Drive



Waste Management

The NSS unit of SIES GST organizes this activity in various areas to collect various types of waste from shops. The main objective of this activity is to increase awareness and inform the course of action about waste management, storage and recycling. It witnesses a large number of volunteers every year and helps in spreading awareness about managing wastes like plastic.

It includes compost filtering, where the volunteers manage a compost generation plant, which is created by eco-friendly methods. Once a year, the volunteers of NSS SIESGST collect the compost and process it. This processing includes filtration and packaging. The packed compost is then sold and the revenues are directed towards social service activities.

Disaster Management Drive

17th and 18th January, 2019

The NSS unit of SIES Graduate School of Technology conducted a two-day Disaster Management Workshop on 17th and 18th January 2019 in partnership with the Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation (NMMC) and United Nations Development Programme (UNDP). The workshop was initiated by The Municipal Commissioner for Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation, Dr N. Ramaswami in presence of The Additional Municipal Commissioner for the Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation, Mr Ravindra Patil; our Principal Dr. Vikram Patil; the NSS Programme Coordinator for Mumbai University, Prof. B S Bidve; CEO for the Aga Khan Agency for Habitat, Ms. Surekha Ghogale; Project Coordinator for the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), Ms. Vrindhanath; the Head of Emergency Management, Mr. Madhukar Sanap the NSS Area Coordinator for Navi Mumbai. Dr. Ram On the first day of the workshop, a seminar was conducted on the basic concepts of disaster management. The objective of this seminar was to inculcate in the attendees, an ability to act quickly and responsibly in times of emergency. The attendees of this workshop participated in a demonstration of the use cases of fire extinguishers in case of a fire-related emergency.

The second day of the workshop included specialized training for specific emergencies like earthquakes, urban/forest fires, medical emergencies, etc. Demonstrations and training on the use of medical bandages, mobilization/transport techniques, rope knots, etc were provided to the attendees. The workshop ended with a felicitation ceremony and certificate distribution for the guests and attendees respectively. 20 students and 6 teachers actively participated in this disaster management drive.

Disaster Management Drill

31st January 2019

The Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation (NMMC) conducted a single day accident management drill along with the volunteers of NSS SIES GST, which witnessed active participation from 26 students and 1 teacher. It was a drill on a realistic scenario based on an accident involving a bus full of passengers (each of whom had a preassigned injury) and a truck carrying chemical substances. A real life accident was simulated and various emergency services such as fire services, ambulances, police, traffic services, etc were tested against the qualities of response time, efficiency, critical thinking and event management. This drill couldn't have been possible without the contributions of Ms. Vrindhanath from the UNDP; the Municipal Commissioner, Dr. N. Ramaswami; Additional Municipal Commissioner, Mr. Ravindra Patil; the representatives of Aga Khan Agency for Habitat and the heads of all the departments that were a part of the drill.
